

BaH PP Strategy: Reforming Public Procurement System

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- September 2004- First PPL
- May 2014- New PPL (in accordance with 2004 Directives)
- The most important institutional pillars of the public procurement system the <u>Public Procurement Agency (11 competencies)</u> and the <u>Procurement Review Body (Second stage review)</u>
- The PPA- legislation, technical assistence, monitoring, e-procurement, trainings, collect data, perform analysis, etc.

Public Procurement Strategy 2016-2020



- Further developing and aligning the legislative framework with the acquis communautaire (including the new EU directives) and EU good practice;
- Enhancing transparency and promoting anti-corruption measures-Anti-corruption Strategy in B&H 2015-2019 6;
- Establishing an effective mechanisms for co-ordination and developing the policy making within the public procurement systems and other policies that could have influence on public procurement system;

Public Procurement Strategy- General objectives (I)





- Strengthening the institutional capacity of key actors within the public procurement system;
- Strengthening competition among economic operators;
- Improving the operational capacity and the functionality of the public procurement system;
- Putting stronger focus on achieving "value for money" based on fair and open competition, within the development of eprocurement system.

Public Procurement Strategy- General objectives (II)

Crucial to reform Public procurement system of BaH

• The Working Group was created (19 members), consisting of representatives from PPA, PRB, DEI, Ministry of Defense, Finance...

 During the drafting of amendments to the PPL - consultations with public procurement trainers, contracting authorities, tenderers, non-governmental sector, other interested parties

- Harmonization with the directives from 2014 (Directive 24/2014 amending Directive 18/2004 and Directive 25/2014 amending Directive 17/2004) current PPL based on the 2004 Directives
- Elimination of technical deficiencies
- Clearer definition of certain (unclear) provisions
- Increase transparency
- GENERAL: Improvement of the Public Procurement System in BiH

- Violation of PPL as a criminal offense
- Total transparency
